CELEBRATION

The Messianic Seder is a celebration of the Passover known in Scripture as the Festival of Unleavened Bread (Matt. 26:17) This celebration continues today in many Jewish homes and communities around the world during Holy Week.



TRADITION

The tradition of the Seder meal comes from celebrating the Passover which began in Exodus when the Lord brought His people out of the land of Egypt. The people were told to celebrate it every year after to remember the Lord's deliverance from bondage. (Exodus 12:42)



THE LAMB

Scripture speaks of perfect lambs being killed and blood being spread over doorposts as the Hebrew people waited for the Lord to "pass over". Now we remember that Jesus Christ, our Passover Lamb, has been sacrificed for us... 1 Corin. 5:7. He took on the judgment that we deserve and paid it with His blood as a spotless lamb.



THE MESSIAH

Jesus, the Messiah, whom people had been waiting for, has come, and now invites us to have life through Him. "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me." Galatians 2:20
